Letter from our Vicar

Dear Friends

As I write this we are still in the middle of this summer's heatwave. I really hope that by the time you read it, we have had some rain. As we drove home from my son's house recently- a local journey we make every week at least - my husband mentioned that he kept feeling the route was unfamiliar. This was because it looked so different. Our green and pleasant land is currently sand -coloured and parched.



All of us are navigating what feels like an unknown and unfamiliar route, as we are not used to not having enough water, nor to extreme heat and no rain. This isn't a new issue of course. At our service in church only this morning we read the Old Testament reading from the book of the prophet Jeremiah. It was headed The Great Drought! And it described the misery of the farmers, the animals, the plant life and the people. In those days people thought God sent drought as a punishment or warning.

Many people are facing water shortages and of course some are living with terrifying wildfires. We no longer believe God sends such things as a punishment, but we should perhaps see them as a warning. We tend to waste water because it is usually abundant in the UK. That means we should all do our best to value it and use it more carefully. And tragically, nearly all wildfires are started by humans, either accidentally from something like a barbeque or deliberately. So, they are often preventable.

Our farmers have been struggling to keep their animals healthy and crops are not growing as well as hoped. While our grass will recover from this drought, many creatures will have lost their lives. The impact is not just on humans. I pray that we will all hear the warnings and work harder as we go forward. Signs are that these events will become more common in the future. The good news is we can all do our bit to help.

Jesus called himself 'the Water of Life'. When we have plenty of water, we probably don't realise the full significance of that. But Jesus lived in an arid land with little water. Water was precious and had to be treasured. So we can perhaps understand it better in times of drought. Water is a wonderful resource, just as the Good News of Jesus Christ is a truly wonderful miracle for us all – the water of life.

Let's all pray that going forward we can all see fresh running water for the miracle it is, and take care to ensure there is enough for us all.

St Albans & District Talking News

‘A sound solution for those with limited sight’

‘From small beginnings come great things’: an oft-repeated proverb that could certainly be applied to the determination of two St Albans residents, Ray and Meg Bousfield, who, as they sat at home back in 1974, decided to find a way to help those who could no longer read a newspaper but wanted to remain in touch with what was happening in the local community.



Starting out with just a tape recorder and microphone on the kitchen table and an audience of one, they launched what was then one of the first Talking News charities in the country. And now, over 50 years later, St Albans & District Talking News (SADTN) operates from a purpose-built, sound-proof studio: digitised recording, memory sticks and online options have evolved from the reel-to-reel tape deck and cassette tapes. A weekly audio programme on a USB stick is posted to each listener's home and an easy-to-use player is provided. Once listened to, the USB is posted back to be used for the next programme.

SADTN is a free service - including postage - for anyone with limited sight or a temporary or long-term condition which limits their access to the written word. The weekly programme covers a range of news items and features from the local papers and other sources. Programmes also include interviews, reviews of audio books, previews of what's coming up on national radio stations, a selection of audio-described TV programmes for the following week, and previews of local events such as talks, music, theatre and other entertainment. All in all, the programme editors ensure that listeners are offered two hours or more of entertaining and informative radio. Everyday operation is in the hands of around 70 volunteers: programme producers, readers, interviewers, previewers and reviewers, copy teams, distribution secretaries and helpers at special events.

Care Home Ministry

Since I arrived in Sandridge over five years ago, I have regularly visited our care homes. Sadly, Lyndon House is now closed. This has, however, enabled me to commit even more time to taking services at Tara's Retreat. These are led by myself and one of the St Albans Anna Chaplains (chaplains for older people).

Twice a month on a Monday we go in and take two services. One is in the downstairs lounge at 10.30am and is aimed at those with memory loss. It includes well known hymns, a Bible story, a talk (usually with props) and short prayers. We then go to the upstairs lounge around 11.00am for a shortened service of Holy Communion. I also visit some residents individually.

If you know someone at Tara's who would like to join in with either service then do contact Lisa, the activities co-ordinator, at tarasactivities@bmcare.co.uk and she can ensure they are enabled to come along. If you know someone who would like a visit, or end of life prayers, then please contact me direct or ask Tara's to do so. I also regularly take funerals for departed residents. As residents are all part of the parish they are entitled to burial or burial of ashes in our churchyards.

Care home ministry is a most rewarding part of my life – over time we form real connections with the residents and become very fond of them. Services are on occasion chaotic, but always joyful!

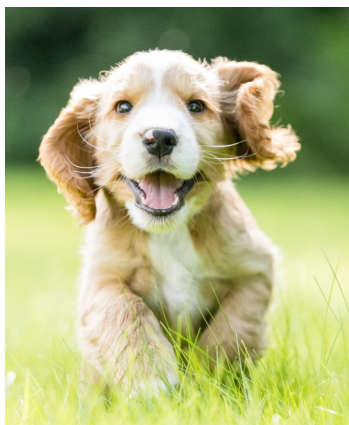

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PARISH COUNCIL SUPPLEMENT (ABRIDGED DRAFT MINUTES)

**AT A MEETING OF SANDRIDGE PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON
8 JULY 2026, THE FOLLOWING ITEMS WERE DISCUSSED:**

TO RECEIVE AND FORMALLY ACCEPT APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies were received and accepted from Councillors Anne Thomas, Adam Twidell, Raihaanah Ahmed.

DISCLOSURES OF INTEREST AND DISPENSATIONS

There was none.

TO APPROVE AS A CORRECT RECORD THE DRAFT MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE COUNCIL HELD ON 10 JUNE 2026

The minutes of the meeting of the Council held on 10 June 2026 were reviewed. They were agreed to be a correct record and it was unanimously resolved that the minutes of the meeting be approved and signed by the Chair.

QUESTIONS TO OFFICERS

There was none.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

There was none.

CLERK'S REPORTS

Monthly Accounts

Members reviewed a schedule of creditor payments for the period 11 June to 8 July 2026. It was unanimously resolved to approve payment of the online transfers on this schedule on 10 July 2026 and to ratify the payment of standing charges and debit card payments already made.

Summer Event 2027/28

Members discussed whether to budget for a significant Parish Council event in 2027/28. It was generally agreed that, with greater financial demands on the Council likely in future, it would be prudent to budget for a lesser sum than in previous years. Additionally, the elections next May could result in a turnover of Members making the timing of an event difficult. It was unanimously resolved to budget a

figure of £5,000 in 2027/28 to allow a small event to take place if so chosen.

Creditor Payments in August

Members were reminded that there is no scheduled Council meeting in August. Creditor payments will therefore be made as usual by the Parish Office with the schedule emailed to Members on 12 August for payment on 14 August. It was unanimously resolved that the Council approves the creditor schedule being sent electronically in August before being ratified in September (this approval is an audit requirement).

Grounds Maintenance Contract

The Clerk and PACE Officer reported meeting with the District Council's Green Spaces Manager regarding the question of when the current grounds maintenance contract will end, with the new unitary authority on the horizon. Members were reminded that the current contract covers the following (not exhaustive);

- * Grass cutting/edging (with varying cut heights and frequencies)
- * Maintaining shrub beds
- * Planting and maintaining herbaceous beds (roundabouts) inc. watering
- * Hedge maintenance
- * Leaf clearance
- * Hanging baskets (provision and daily watering)
- * Emptying approximately 50 bins daily inc. 2 recycling bins (transferred to Veolia depot)
- * Litter picking/fly tipping clearance
- * Sweeping hard surfaces (including use of 'Scarab' road sweeper)
- * Footpath maintenance
- * Detailed independent tree surveys (3 year cycle)
- * Play area maintenance and daily inspections
- * Annual independent play area inspections
- * Bench cleaning and maintenance
- * Cricket pitch maintenance (specialist equipment)
- * Football pitch maintenance (specialist equipment)
- * Tennis court/MUGA/netball court maintenance
- * Snow/ice clearance and gritting car parks and paths around centres

Note, all the above subject to strict contract specification. The Parish Council also benefits from a competitive Schedule of Rates for works outside the contract, for example bench installation.

It was unanimously resolved to ratify the Clerk's request to the District Council to remain in the existing GM contract for a further five years, during which time alternatives are to be explored.

Members reviewed and unanimously resolved to re-adopt this policy for review in three years.

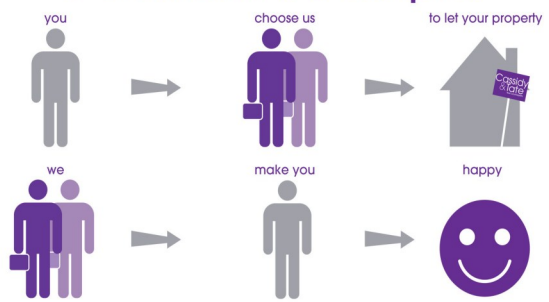
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
